On behalf of the organizing committee, we are delighted to invite you to the 4<sup>th</sup> Sulphyton Workshop in Athens, Greece, which will take place in the Stanley Hotel Athens from the 5<sup>th</sup> to the 8<sup>th</sup> of September 2013.

The Sulphyton Workshops are a forum established by the Plant Sulfur Network in order to offer an opportunity to its members and especially to the students, to present and discuss the latest developments in the field of sulfur research within plants in a friendly and informal environment. Traditionally, a Sulphyton meeting takes place in the period between the regular International Sulfur Workshops, and it aims to connect the different areas of sulfur research in plants including basic research on all aspects of sulfur metabolism in plants, the use and importance of sulfur in agriculture and biogeochemistry, plant sulfur nutrition, sulfur and its roles for stress responses, cross talks of metabolic pathways interacting with sulfur, etc.

The Sulphyton concept proved to be a highly successful one as the plant sulfur society has got more opportunities to see each other and discuss the current ideas, approaches, and developments and several collaborations have emerged through the years; even more importantly Sulphyton is a chance to meet friends and colleagues, thus strengthening the connections between the sulfur community and its effectiveness.

Therefore, we would like to particularly encourage PhD students and postdocs to give oral presentations at reduced conference fees. All participants can be accommodated at the conference venue at reduced prices.

Registration and abstract submission are now open and the deadline is 30<sup>th</sup> June 2013.
